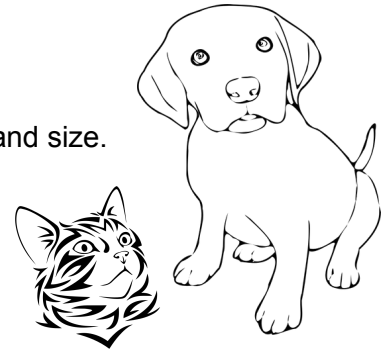


# I've adopted, NOW WHAT???
